Fact Sheet: VA Screening and Evaluation Data on Iraq and Afghanistan Era Veterans Using VA Health Care

March 2020

Introduction: This fact sheet is the second in a two-part series on traumatic brain injury (TBI). Part 1 presents data on all-cause TBI among all Veterans who receive medical care within the Veterans Health Administration (VHA). Part 2 summarizes VA TBI screening and evaluation data collected on a subset of this population. TBI cases reported here include injuries sustained by Veterans during their deployment to Operations Enduring Freedom, Iraqi Freedom, and New Dawn (OEF/OIF/OND).

Methods

Population: OEF/OIF/OND era Veterans aged 18-110 years who used VHA health care during fiscal year (FY) 2019

Data Source: VA TBI screening and evaluation database accessed through the VA Corporate Data Warehouse (CDW)²

Analyses: This supplement presents the number (%) of Veterans diagnosed with deployment-related TBI through the VA TBI screening and evaluation process and the number (%) of Veterans who completed key steps in the process.

Background

- Starting in April 2007, all Veterans deployed for OEF/OIF/ OND must be screened for TBI upon entry into VHA care.³ The screening aims to identify Veterans who sustained TBIs during deployment and who experienced symptoms in the past week.
- Veterans screen positive if they were previously diagnosed with TBI during deployment or if they answer 'yes' to all 4 questions in the screening tool. Those who screen positive are referred for a comprehensive TBI evaluation (CTBIE) by TBI specialists to confirm or rule out a TBI diagnosis.³
- The Office of Rehabilitation and Prosthetic Services collects TBI screening and evaluation data through the TBI clinical reminder, TBI screen, and CTBIE.
- These data only capture TBIs sustained by Veterans who were screened and received a diagnosis through a CTBIE. Not reflected in the data are injuries endured by Veterans who:
 - 1) Did not serve in the OEF/OIF/OND era
 - 2) Were not deployed for OEF/OIF/OND
 - 3) Were referred but did not receive a CTBIE
 - 4) Were injured before or after deployment

Summary of VA TBI Screening and Evaluation Data among OEF/OIF/OND Era Veterans who used VHA Health Care in Fiscal Year 2019

1,387,422 (86.9%) Veterans screened for deployment-related TBI at any point in time

189,411 (11.9%) Veterans screened positive and were referred to CTBIE

172,315 (10.8%) Veterans completed CTBIE
